A Letter from Director Dr. Barbara Jackson



We all know that hands-on, real life learning is the best education of all. Yet we all also understand that most of the core concepts and competencies of Real Estate and Construction Management is typically learned through a University education. The Burns School of Real Estate and Construction Management has figured out a way for students to do both while completing their degree at the University of Denver.

We have recently launched a new initiative associated with helping students gain new knowledge outside the classroom through Performance Accelerator Workshops (PAW Program). These workshops connect the Burns School with an industry partner to host short course educational opportunities related to specialized topics most pertinent to the RE and AEC industries today. This quarter, we have partnered with Mortenson Construction who is hosting the Mortenson **BIM Boot Camp** for students of the Burns School. This non-credit short course focuses on how best to utilize Building Information Modeling, and other technologies like Blue Beam and Sketch-Up, to better manage construction and development projects. There are no additional fees or tuition charged to students who attend the workshops. We see this opportunity as a value-added experience enhancing their educations. Because there are only a limited number of seats in each of these specialized sessions, students must apply to attend the Performance Accelerator Workshops. Each student receives a Certificate of Completion at the end of the session, along with an applied knowledge of technology as it is used on the job and exposure to the wisdom and experience of seasoned practitioners in the industry. Of course, the great benefit to the companies that partner with the Burns School in the delivery of these workshops is that they get to engage with and meet some of our best and brightest students and get a jump start in the recruiting process in their search for interns and new graduates.

Because of accreditation requirements, credit limits, high tuition costs, and other restrictions associated with the traditional university education model, it is very difficult to teach students many of the practical, hands on components of the industry that we would like to. Although the Burns School does a good job of it, these Performance Accelerator Workshops give our students an additional edge. It's also a great way for students to begin building their professional network. It's a win-win all around for the students and the companies who participate in the program.

The project for the Challenge was the Midtowr Industrial Center in River North (aka RiNO). RiNO is one of Denver's most active areas for hip and edgy developments. It is the home of art galleries, restaurants, bars and breweries; a hot spot for attracting creative entrepreneurs. Students participating in the Challenge had to evaluate the mixed-use site and make their

recommendations for developing it. Each final team's idea was presented to a panel of judges from the industry which looks for feasibility, creativity, marketing plans and sound financial forecasting as part of the criteria for a winning project. Students from the two programs compete against one another for scholarships, future employment and the prestigious and very large NAIOP Cup; a traveling trophy which the winning team proudly displays at their school for one year.

Winning teams reach the Challenge by first competing internally for the right to represent their respective University. Approximately 40 students were initially involved preparing for the internal competition. The winning DU team first had to get past their fellow student team with stiff competition from Campbell Clarey, Lauren Conrad, Zachary Cornell, Adam Katz, Hanbo Li, Andrea Morgan and Brian Veatch.

Over the 13 year period that DU has been competing against CU in the NAIOP Real Estate Challenge, DU has carried eight wins and CU five. The two schools always present great teams and the evening is one for high levels of entertainment for the industry. Burns congratulates all students from DU and CU who participated in this extremely time-intensive and rewarding experience.
