NOTE: To earn the IMBA and MA in GFTEI as a dual degree, you must be admitted to both programs, pursue the degrees concurrently, and meet all requirements for both degrees. If one degree is completed prior to the completion of the other degree, the second degree must be completed within 18 months of the first degree. In addition, a student may not apply to the dual degree program after either degree has been awarded.
