\* Courses taken through the DU Law School may be substituted for LGST 4700 and/or a portion of the International Studies courses. However, a minimum of 58 hours of distinct course work must be completed for the IMBA. Contact an IMBA advisor for more details.

\*\* A \$2,500 experience fee will be assessed for this course. In addition, students will be responsible for the costs of international airfare and non-group meals. Please note that this experience fee is subject to change.

\*\*\*Please refer to MBA and IMBA Concentration sheet for available concentrations. Electives must be graduate (4000-level) courses.

NOTE: To earn the IMBA and the Juris Doctrate (JD) as a dual degree, you must be admitted to both programs, pursue the degrees concurrently, and meet all requirements for both degrees. Students should complete both degrees at the same time. However, students can receive the first degree as long as all original requirements and credits for the first degree have been met. They then have up to 18 months to complete the second degree. In addition, a student may not apply to the dual degree program after either degree has been awarded. Students must file a formal application with both programs to graduate from both programs. **PLEASE NOTE: JD students will not be graduated and certified to take the bar examination unless both programs have been completed.**

For detailed academic policy information, refer to Graduate Student Handbook. An overall GPA of 3.0 is required for graduation.
